Articles should be prepared in compliance with the requirements established by the *MLA Style Manual*, 7th edition (2009). Manuscripts should consist of approximately 6,000 words. The original and a copy must be submitted along with a digital copy and a self-addressed envelope with return postage. All manuscripts are anonymously refereed. Therefore, the manuscripts should contain no obvious reference to the author, though the author's name, address, telephone number, and email address should be included on a separate title page. A current subscription to the journal is strongly recommended before the manuscript undergoes the review process.

The *Afro-Hispanic Review* is published twice annually by the Department of Spanish and Portuguese at Vanderbilt University. Annual subscription rates for two issues are \$50.00 for individuals (\$60 international) and \$90.00 for institutions (\$100.00 international).
